## Eastern NC Transition Supports Program FAQs

### How do I apply for the Transition Supports program?

### Who can attend the Transition Supports program?

Teens and young adults ages 16-26 who reside in the Trillium service area (Counties included are Beaufort, Bertie, Brunswick, Camden, Carteret, Chowan, Columbus, Craven, Currituck, Dare, Gates, Hertford, Hyde, Jones, Martin, Nash, New Hanover, Northampton, Onslow, Pamlico, Pasquotank, Pender, Perquimans, Pitt, Tyrrell, and Washington.)

### Where will the programming take place?

The program will take place at the locations listed below and in the community around them:

- Wilmington location: 705 S. Kerr Ave., Wilmington, NC 28403
- Greenville location: 2045-C Eastgate Drive, Greenville, NC 27858

### When will the programming take place?

The program will run year round. Participants will be able to choose from a variety of morning, afternoon, and evening sessions.

### How much will the program cost?

This program has been underwritten by Trillium Health Services. Those who receive placements in the program must be willing to be identified by Trillium and enrolled in their system as Medicaid or IPRS eligible. This is mandatory to receive the service at no cost.

**What is the level of care provided by the program?**

We plan to provide 1:1 support as needed for activities in the community and individualized services. Larger ratios may also occur for group and social activities as appropriate.

**What type of training does staff receive?**

Intensive training on autism, employment services, and strategies for independent skill-building is provided. Employees also receive client-specific training to ensure an individualized approach to needs and services.

We conduct thorough background checks on all employees and hold them to high expectations.

**Are people on the autism spectrum the only ones allowed to attend this program?**

A primary diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder is required to attend the program.
